#### PROGRAM STRUCTURE AND IMPACT

The 13 studies were conducted over a period of five months, with participants engaging in three studies each month. The structure allowed for in-depth discussions and reflection on the topics covered. The participants expressed great joy and had numerous "aha moments" throughout the program. Here are five quotes highlighting key learnings and revelations from different participants:

- a. Jane Muthoni Gachanga: "I always thought that submission meant being inferior or silent. However, through this study, I learned that submission is about mutual respect and honoring one another's roles. It has transformed my understanding of marriage."
- b. Miriam N. Muya: "The study on patriarchy and dominance was eye-opening. I realized that God's intention was never for men to dominate women, but for both to have equal value and purpose. This understanding has changed the way I view myself and how I interact with others."
- c. Hannah Njoki Njuguna: "The study on Jesus's message to the world about women not being sex objects deeply impacted me. It made me recognize the importance of dignity and respect for women, and how society's objectification of women goes against God's design."
- d. Christopher G. Njau: "As the only male participant, I initially had reservations about joining this study. However, through the sessions on honor, authority, and headship, I gained a deeper understanding of my role as a husband and leader in a way that promotes equality and love."
- e. Florence Wanjiru Gachanga: "The study on redemption from the curse gave me hope and reminded me that Christ's sacrifice restores our true identity and purpose. It empowered me to break free from societal expectations and embrace the freedom we have in Christ."

#### PROGRAM LOGISTICS

The outreach program was carefully planned and implemented to ensure its effectiveness and accessibility. Here are some key logistics:

a. Venue: The program was conducted at Gracestar Prayer Center, Ndumberi, Kiambu County. which was a central location that was easily accessible to all participants. It was a venue graciously offered for the Bible study sessions, providing a comfortable and conducive environment for learning and discussion.

- b. Schedule: The program started in December 2022 and divided into 13 sessions, with three studies covered each month. Sessions were held once a week, allowing participants sufficient time for reflection and preparation between meetings. Each session lasted approximately two hours, providing ample time for in-depth discussions.
- c. Facilitators: The program was facilitated by a trained team of leaders who had a deep understanding of the study material and its biblical foundations. The facilitators fostered an environment of openness, encouraging participants to share their thoughts, ask questions, and engage in meaningful dialogue. The facilitators were,
